Buying at Auction

The following pages are designed to give you useful information on how to buy at **PT. Balai Lelang Larasati** - herein referred to as **LARASATI** - fine art auction.

Upon signing the Bidder Registration Form, all Bidder are legally bound to all terms and conditions as printed in the catalog and other supplements of them provided at registration.

Bidding by Internet LIVE Auctions

For LIVE Auctions, the Company does not provide in-house real-time bidding service. However, bids may be placed through the Internet Bid System provided by INVALUABLE (hereinafter referred to as the "Real-Time Internet Bidding"). Any person who intends to participate must register through INVALUABLE as the appointed third party company for Real-Time Internet Bidding and is bound to the INVALUABLE's Terms and Conditions of the sale. Please note that for this "particular" sale, no surcharge of 5% will be charged.

1. BEFORE THE AUCTION

Pre-sale Estimates

The pre-sale estimates are intended as a guide for prospective buyers. Any bid between the high and the low pre-sale estimates would, in our opinion, offer a fair chance of success. However, all lots, depending on the degree of competition, can realise prices either above or below the pre-sale estimates.

Reserves

The reserve is the minimum price the seller is willing to accept below which the lot will not be sold.

Condition of Lots

Prospective buyers are encouraged to inspect the property at the pre-sale exhibition. Solely as a convenience, Larasati may provide condition reports. The absence of reference to the condition of a lot in the catalog description does not imply that the lot is free from faults or imperfections.

2. THE AUCTION

Conditions of Business

The Auction is governed by the Conditions of Business printed in this catalog. These Conditions of Business apply to all aspects of the relationship between Larasati and actual and prospective bidders and buyers. Anyone considering bidding in the auction should read them carefully. They may be amended by way of notices posted in the saleroom, any additional information in the form of handouts or attachments to Bidder Registration Form, Absentee Bid Form or by way of announcement made by the auctioneer.

Bidding at Auction

Bids may be executed in person by paddle during the auction, in writing prior to the sale or by telephone. All auctions are conducted in Indonesian Rupiahs. Auction speeds vary, but usually average between 40 - 50 lots per hour.

Consecutive and Responsive Bidding

The Auctioneer may open the bidding on any lot by placing a bid on behalf of the seller. The Auctioneer may further bid on behalf of the seller, up to the amount of the reserve, by placing consecutive or responsive bids for a lot.

Bidding Increments

Bidding generally opens below the low estimates and advances in the following increments:

However, the auctioneer may change the increments during the course of the auction at his or her discretion.

Bidding in Person

To bid in person at the auction, you will need to register for and collect a numbered paddle before the auction begins. Proof of identity will be required.

The paddle is used to indicate your bids to the auctioneer during the sale. Should you be the successful buyer of any lot, please ensure that your paddle can be seen by the auctioneer and that it is your number that is called out. Should there be any doubts as to price or buyer, please draw the auctioneer's attention to it immediately. All lots sold will be invoiced to the name and address in which the paddle has been registered and cannot be transferred to other names and addresses.

Please do not mislay your paddle; in the event of loss please inform the Sales Clerk immediately. At the end of the sale, please return your paddle to the registration desk.

Absentee / Written Bids

If you cannot attend the auction, we will be happy to execute written bids on your behalf. A bidding form can be found at the back of this catalog. This service is free and confidential. Lots will always be bought as cheaply as is consistent with other bids and the reserves. In the event of identical bids, the earliest bid received will take precedence. Always indicate a "top limit" - the hammer price to which you would bid if you were attending the auction yourself. "Buy" and unlimited bids will not be accepted.

To ensure satisfactory service to bidders, please ensure that we receive your bids at least 24 hours before the sale.

Bidding by Telephone

If you cannot attend the auction, it is possible to bid on the telephone on lots with a minimum low estimate of Rp 10.000.000,-. As the number of telephone lines is limited, it is necessary to make arrangements for this service 24 hours before the sale. We also suggest that you have a maximum bid which we can execute on your behalf in the event we are unable to reach you by telephone. Bilingual staff are available to execute bids for you.

Successful Bids

The fall of the auctioneer's hammer indicates the final bid. The auctioneer will call out and record the name or "paddle" number of the buyer, if your written bid is successful, you will be notified immediately after the sale by post. Bidding may be reopened at the auctioneer's discretion.

Currency Conversion

Bidding is carried out in Indonesian Rupiahs, but Larasati may provide a currency conversion board in the saleroom for the convenience of bidders. Please note that figures shown in foreign currencies are only approximates and do not represent exact exchange rates. Payment will be requested in Indonesian Rupiahs.

3. AFTER THE AUCTION**Payment**

Payment must be made within three calendar days of the sale by telegraphic transfer to Larasati's account as stated in the invoice.

Collection

Lots will be released to you or your authorized representative when full and cleared payment has been received by Larasati.

Items retained will be covered by our insurance from the date of sale for a period of seven days or, if by then the goods have been collected, to the time of collection. After seven days or from the time of collection, whichever is the earlier, the lot will be entirely at the buyer's risk.

Storage and Insurance

All purchases will initially be held for collection at the saleroom at no charge. Larasati provides insurance cover for a maximum of seven days after the sale. If purchases are not collected within the time stated in the catalog, they will be deposited in the warehouse and charges will be incurred.

Packing and Handling

We shall use all reasonable effort to take care when handling and packing a purchased lot but remind the buyer that after seven days or from the time of collection, the lot is entirely at the buyer's risk.

Shipping

Shipping can also be arranged on your behalf. You can also instruct the shipper of your choice, either immediately after the sale, if you are attending or in writing on the instruction form sent with our invoice.

Despite its title, *"Boy in Blue Shirt"* is dominated not by blue but by an overwhelming field of red — a saturated, textured crimson that consumes nearly the entire canvas. Popo Iskandar, one of Indonesia's most distinctive modernist painters, builds this ground with thick, uneven strokes, letting the pigment sit heavily on the surface so that light catches its ridges and valleys. The effect is less backdrop than atmosphere: the colour seems to breathe and pulse around the solitary figure at its centre.

The boy himself sits with legs drawn together, gaze lowered, his posture folded inward in a gesture of quiet introspection. The artist renders the figure with deliberate simplicity — soft ochre tones for skin, loosely modelled features, and a deep ultramarine shirt whose crumpled folds are picked out with dark, restless brushwork. This contrast between the figure's muted, earthbound palette and the blazing red surrounding him creates a tension central to the work: the child appears both anchored and isolated, a small human presence set against an overwhelming field of colour.

Characteristic of Iskandar's mature style, the painting favours emotional resonance over descriptive detail. Faces are simplified almost to masks, yet convey a distinct interiority — a private, unguarded moment observed rather than staged. This economy of form, paired with his signature textured surfaces, reflects Iskandar's lifelong interest in expressive colour and gestural spontaneity, qualities that align him with Indonesia's broader modernist movement while remaining unmistakably his own. *"Boy in Blue Shirt"* stands as a meditation on solitude, rendered through the artist's bold and instinctive command of paint.

In *"Two Balinese Dancers"*, Anton Huang transforms the traditional Legong dancer into a vehicle for bold, decorative abstraction. Two figures stand shoulder to shoulder against a fiery vermilion ground, their crowned heads crowned further by cascading white blossoms that echo the ceremonial headdresses of Balinese performance. Huang's palette is rich and unrestrained, layering turquoise, ochre, and jade against passages of intricate patterning that recall traditional songket and batik textiles.

What distinguishes this work is its fusion of figuration with textile-like ornamentation: the dancers' torsos dissolve into dense grids of geometric motif, star-forms, and interlocking borders, rendered with the density of woven cloth rather than painted fabric. Their oversized, outstretched hands, elongated and expressive, gesture with the codified elegance of Balinese dance, while their serene, heavy-lidded faces impart a meditative stillness amid the visual abundance surrounding them.

Painted in Ubud in 1974, the work reflects Huang's deep engagement with Balinese aesthetics, reimagined through a modernist sensibility that prizes pattern, colour intensity, and decorative rhythm as expressive ends in themselves.

East Indies Visions: European Eyes on the Archipelago

This section brings together nine oil paintings by four artists closely associated with the *Mooi Indië* ("Beautiful Indies") tradition — Ernest Dezentje, Leonardus Joseph Eland, Lucien Frits Ohl, Wihelminus Jean Frederic Imandt, and Gerard Pieter Adolfs. Working across the late colonial and early post-independence periods, these painters shared a fascination with the tropical light, colour, and daily rhythms of Indonesia, filtered through a distinctly European painterly sensibility.

Their subjects range widely: figures resting beneath the flame-red canopy of flamboyant trees, women bartering at bustling markets, the solemn architecture of temple courtyards, and sweeping landscapes of rice terraces and volcanic hills. Each artist brings his own touch — Dezentje's atmospheric warmth, Adolfs's confident brushwork, Ohl and Imandt's attentive expression — yet all are united by a shared devotion to capturing the archipelago's visual splendour.

Together, these works offer a window into a romanticized, artistically rich vision of Indonesia as seen through Western eyes of the era.

Gerard Pieter Adolfs, one of the foremost chroniclers of colonial-era Java, brings his characteristic vivacity to "Women at the Market in Surabaja," a canvas alive with tropical light and bustling human presence. Two women dominate the foreground, their vivid green and yellow garments striking against a loosely rendered backdrop of weathered walls and warm terracotta tones. One carries a woven basket balanced with practiced ease, a detail that grounds the scene in the daily rhythms of market life, while a third figure crouches nearby beside baskets of produce, her white robes catching the strong midday sun.

Adolfs's brushwork here is confident and unlaboured, built from broad, energetic strokes that prioritize atmosphere and movement over fine detail. This painterly looseness, combined with his instinct for colour harmony, reflects the influence of European Impressionism filtered through decades of immersion in Indonesian subject matter. The interplay of cool shadow and radiant light across the sandy ground demonstrates his mastery of tropical illumination, a hallmark that distinguishes his work within the broader *Mooi Indië* tradition.

Having passed through Christie's Singapore in March 1999, this painting carries a documented history among collectors of Indonesian colonial-era art. It stands as a vibrant example of Adolfs's enduring fascination with everyday life in Java, capturing not merely a market scene but the dignity and quiet industry of its subjects.

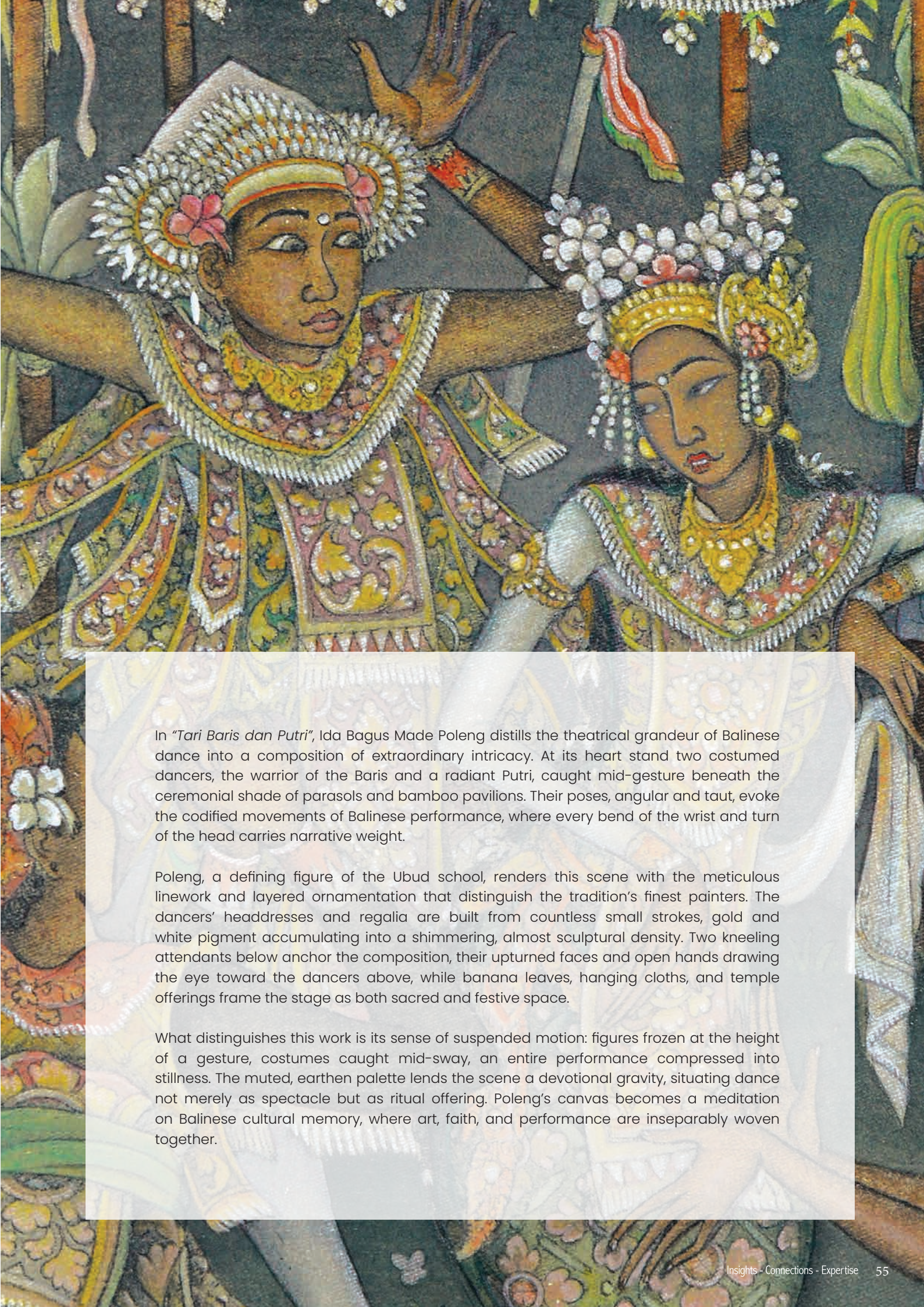

In *"Tari Baris dan Putri"*, Ida Bagus Made Poleng distills the theatrical grandeur of Balinese dance into a composition of extraordinary intricacy. At its heart stand two costumed dancers, the warrior of the Baris and a radiant Putri, caught mid-gesture beneath the ceremonial shade of parasols and bamboo pavilions. Their poses, angular and taut, evoke the codified movements of Balinese performance, where every bend of the wrist and turn of the head carries narrative weight.

Poleng, a defining figure of the Ubud school, renders this scene with the meticulous linework and layered ornamentation that distinguish the tradition's finest painters. The dancers' headdresses and regalia are built from countless small strokes, gold and white pigment accumulating into a shimmering, almost sculptural density. Two kneeling attendants below anchor the composition, their upturned faces and open hands drawing the eye toward the dancers above, while banana leaves, hanging cloths, and temple offerings frame the stage as both sacred and festive space.

What distinguishes this work is its sense of suspended motion: figures frozen at the height of a gesture, costumes caught mid-sway, an entire performance compressed into stillness. The muted, earthen palette lends the scene a devotional gravity, situating dance not merely as spectacle but as ritual offering. Poleng's canvas becomes a meditation on Balinese cultural memory, where art, faith, and performance are inseparably woven together.





CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS FOR BUYERS

Larasati as agent

Bidding as Principal

When making a bid, prospective buyer will be accepting personal liability, unless it has been agreed in writing, at the time of registration, that a bidder is acting as agent on behalf of a third party acceptable to us.

Commission Bids

If a prospective buyer gives us instructions to bid on his behalf, by using the form printed after the catalog entries, we shall use reasonable efforts to do so, provided these instructions are received not later than 24 hours before the sale. Bids should be placed in Indonesian Rupiahs. Bids placed in other currencies will be converted to Indonesian Rupiahs using the one month forward rate of exchange quoted to us by CIMB Niaga Bank at opening on the date of the auction and the Indonesian Rupiahs figure may be subject to rounding. The buyer's invoice will be in Indonesian Rupiahs and we shall not be liable to the buyer for any loss suffered as a result of exchange rate movements after the date of the sale. If we receive commission bids on a particular lot for identical amounts, and at auction these bids are the highest bids for the lot, it will be sold to the person whose bid was received first. Commission bids are undertaken subject to other commitments at the time of the sale, and the conduct of the sale may be such that we are unable to bid as requested. For LIVE Auctions, the Company does not provide in-house real-time bidding service. However, bids may be placed through the Internet Bid System provided by INVALIDABLE (hereinafter referred to as the "Real-Time Internet Bidding"). Any person who intends to participate must register through INVALIDABLE as the appointed third party company for Real-Time Internet Bidding and is bound to the INVALIDABLE's Terms and Conditions of the sale. Please note that for this "particular" sale, no surcharge of 5% will be charged.

Currency Converter

At this auction, a currency converter may be operated, based on the one month forward rates of exchange quoted to us by CIMB Niaga Bank at opening on the date of the auction. Bidding will however take place in Indonesian Rupiahs. The currency converter is not always reliable, and errors may occur beyond our control either in the accuracy of the lot number displayed on the converter, or the foreign currency equivalent of Indonesian Rupiahs bids.

We shall not be liable to the buyer for any loss suffered as a result of the buyer following the currency converter, rather than the Indonesian Rupiahs bidding.

Video images
